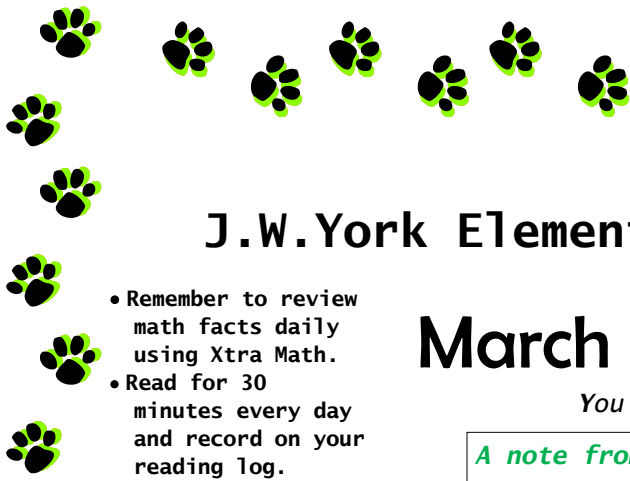

Curriculum Corner:

Reading: Biographies

The students are continuing to make connections between sentences and paragraphs while reading informational text and determining the type of text structure used (cause/effect, compare/contrast, description, problem/solution, sequence). This week, we are focusing on cause and effect structures and identifying which statement is the cause and which is the effect.

Writing: Autobiographies

This week, the students finishing up drafting their autobiographies with their When I Grow Up, Fun Facts and Conclusion sections. After drafting, we will revise and edit our drafts in order to get them ready to publish.

Math: Fractions-Understanding Fractions

This week, the students are learning how to identify the fraction of a set or of a whole number and finding simple equivalent fractions. Social Studies: Culture & Geography
