

Curriculum Corner:

Reading: Informational Texts

This week, we are continuing to focus on identifying various text structures when reading non fiction texts. We will review identifying cause and effect relationships when reading informational texts. We are also taking our third quarter summative on Tuesday. It will be our last review prior to EOGs.

Writing: Autobiographies
