

Curriculum Corner:

Reading: Biographies

This week, the students are continuing to make connections between sentences and paragraphs while reading informational text and determining the type of text structure used (cause/effect, compare/contrast, description, problem/solution, sequence). We are learning how to distinguish our point of view from that of the author's when reading biographies.

Writing: Autobiographies

This week, the students are continuing to draft their autobiographies. We are working on our favorite memories from second and third grade, when I grow up and writing a strong conclusion.

Math: Fractions-Understanding Fractions

This week, the students are applying what they have learned from partitioning shapes in order to continue to build their understanding of fractions. The students are continuing to conceptualize that a fraction is a part of a whole, and determining the unit fractions (1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 1/6, 1/8). They are adding up unit fractions and writing the fraction that represents the whole. For additional help or support, click on the math at a glance tab on the class website. Remember to please continue to reinforce math fact practice throughout the school year with the Xtra math program at home.

Social Studies: Culture & Geography

In this unit, the students are learning about culture and diversity. We are studying what is culture and how different cultures contributed to American culture as we know it today.
