Curriculum Corner:

Reading: Informational Texts

We are continuing to focus on identifying various text structures when reading informational texts. This week, we are reviewing the different types of text structures in how sentences and paragraphs are connected.

Writing: Cultural Heritage Project

Last week, we researched a country from our heritage background. This week, the students will be working on create a digital presentation of their cultural heritage by creating a 'board' using Discovery Education website.

Math: Equivalent Fractions

This week, the students are continuing to extend their knowledge of fractions by finding equivalent fractions using a variety of strategies (models, numberlines, multiply/divide).
